Residential Average Rates

AEP SWEPCO	State Average	National Average
7.86 ¢/kWh	8.71 ¢/kWh	12.01 ¢/kWh

SWEPCO average Residential rate is **9.8%** less expensive than the state average, **34.6%** less than the national average!

Commercial Average Rates
